## Meeting Your Goal

Whenever an employee or member of a Lifesaver Club donates blood, the donation can be counted toward the club's goal regardless of where it was made. Spouses, friends and clients can also be included in your Lifesaver Club totals. Please ask your donors to specify on their blood donor record that their donation be applied to your Lifesaver Club goal.

## Club Qualifications

To be considered a Lifesaver Club, companies or organizations must:

- ◆ Have a coordinator designated by a CEO or club leadership.
- ◆ Provide opportunities for employees or members to learn about the never-ending need for blood.
- ◆ Establish an annual goal for pints of blood drawn.
- ◆ Set a participation goal based on a percentage of employees or members.
